



#### Uniform reminders


Children should only be wearing a navy blue school jumper or cardigan to school. Some children are attending school in sports jumpers and hoodies.

Meet the SENDCo drop in continues each week on a Monday morning with Mrs Parish at 9am.




#### Year 4 Multiplication check




# Recommended books!
