



#### Easter Attendance Incentive

Each day from Monday 31st March to Friday 4th April, all children attending school (and arriving on time) will be entered into a raffle. One child from each class in school that day will be in with the chance of winning an Easter Egg.



### Persistent absence category

As a school we strive for the best possible attendance. Good attendance leads to positive outcomes for children. Currently, our school percentages of persistent absence is significantly higher than the national average.

Where a child's attendance percentage is 90% or below, they are considered nationally as a persistently absent child. So what does that actually mean? When we think about 90%, many of us may consider this to be good. You would be pleased to achieve 90% in a test wouldn't you?

However, 90% in the context of attendance is not a positive picture. 90% is the equivalent of 20 days (4 weeks) absent from school within a school year. This is 1/2 a day a week. This is a lot of missed learning time and missed social time.

Setting high expectations of school attendance in the primary years is essential! It supports positive attitudes to attendance in the secondary years and once our children grow to become working adults.

Mary Poppins

As we still have some remaining seats for our theatre trip to see Mary Poppins in June, we have now opened the trip up to children in Year 3. A letter has been emailed out to Y3 parents this week. 


### Recommended books!


