



CHANGES

From Monday 3rd March we started following the updated policy. Thank you for your patience as we transition to this new policy. We are not trying to catch anyone out or be difficult, our priority is keeping our children safe.

Please remember that staff will not release children to adults who do not usually collect a child. If a different person will be collecting you must notify a member of school staff. For example, your child is going to their friends house for tea.



It saddens me to have to post this message, however we have received a number of complaints about swearing and bad language being used by parents, carers and family members during school drop off and collection. Some of this is on the school site and some of it is around the perimeter. Please be considerate about the language you use while around the school site. Children learn from the adults around them and we do not want children repeating some of the language that is being heard.
